The past year will perhaps be most remembered for the number of days spent by the Commissioners and Deputies in NYS Supreme Court relative to the Amedore v. Tkaczyk contest. That proved to be the culmination of a year that saw us administer three primaries, one village and one general election.

Just when we were becoming comfortable and confident with what appears to be an annual series of upgrades to the election machines, the State Board ordered another series of major modifications to our coding of ballots that will in turn require increased focus on our work with the County "IT" department and an enhanced training of our 350 plus inspectors and alternates.

We have also been ordered by the NYS Board of Elections to immediately cease our practice of sending absentees out to the poll sites to be counted on election night, a practice we utilized as a cost saving measure. These ballots are now tallied at our office at the recount process. Additionally, we have also been ordered to insure that the election machine "flash cards" are to be returned to the elections office on election night, another practice that we deferred in the interest of economy. We have been in contact with Sheriff Seeley who assures us that his staff will enable us to comply with this directive.

We continue to review the number and location of poll sites in an effort to merge locations where possible and have participated with a majority of other counties in lobbying all election printers to bring down their costs, an effort that is finally meeting with some success.

Our deputies and clerks continue to perform in an extraordinary manner to keep pace with an election environment that is both challenging and ever changing.


