Authorizing The County Of Greene To Convey Part Of An Abandoned Parcel In The Town Of Lexington To Adjacent Land Owners

WHEREAS, the County of Greene is the owner of a piece of property which consists of an abandoned roadway located on and around a section of old New York State Route 23A consisting of approximately 2.08 acres located adjacent to Tax Map Parcel No. 109.00-1-7 and 109.00-1-8; and

WHEREAS, the County of Greene has no use for this particular piece of property and it is of no value to the County; and

WHEREAS, adjacent landowners, Donald A. Falke and John E. Falke, wish to have conveyed to them a part of the parcel containing 0.15 acres being more particularly bound and described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, 30 Brown's Crossing Road, Inc. wishes to have conveyed to it part of a parcel comprising approximately 0.47 acres being more particularly bound and described in Exhibit "B" attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County of Greene is authorized to deed the within described property to the identified grantees by quitclaim deed subject to the approval as to form by the Greene County Attorney.

Amending Agreement with Local 968 AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Council 66 Regarding the Temporary Change of Work Hours and Work Days

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 328-12 adopted on October 17, 2012; the Greene County Legislature authorized an Agreement with Local 968 AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Council 66, covering the years January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2014;

WHEREAS, a labor management meeting was held on May 2, 2014 between representatives of the AFSCME Union and the County to discuss a temporary change in work hours and work days from five eight- hour days per week to four ten-hour days per week, in an effort to increase efficiency and reduce expenses; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Union agree that this work schedule, has been implemented since 2008, has proven to be beneficial and cost efficient and they further agree that the same change in work hours and work days from five eight-hour days, to four ten-hour days per week, will be implemented on a temporary basis, effective Monday, June 2, 2014 and continue through Friday, August 29, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Acting Chairman of the Greene County Legislature be and hereby is authorized to execute a Memorandum of Agreement with Local 968, AFSCME, AFL-CIO Council 66, amending the current contract.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

The County of Greene and AFSCME Council 66, local 968, are parties to a Collective Bargaining Agreement for the term of January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2014.

The County and Local 968, in an effort to increase efficiency and reduce expenses incurred due to the high cost of fuel have reached an understanding concerning a change in workdays and work hours to be implemented on a temporary basis and agree as follows:

1. On May 1, 2014, a Labor Management meeting was convened between representatives of the AFSCME Union and the County to discuss a temporary change in work hours and workdays from five eight hour days, to four ten hour days per week.
2. The County and the Union agree that this work schedule has been implemented previously since 2008 and has proven to be beneficial and cost efficient and further agree that the same change in work hours and workdays from five eight hour days, to four ten hour days per week will be implemented on a temporary basis, effective June 2, 2014 and continue through August 29, 2014.
3. The County and the Union agree that during this temporary change regular work hours will be 6:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., Monday through Thursday and that the Building Supervisors will ensure that the workforce is deployed from the buildings no later than 6:30 A.M., and that work is performed without undue disturbance in populated areas. It is further agreed that work will continue until at least 4:00 P.M., unless it is determined by the Building Supervisor that additional travel time is required to return to the building.
4. The County and the Union further agree that in order to provide coverage on Fridays during this temporary change in work schedule, regular work hours for the two employees assigned to sign maintenance will be 6:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., Tuesday through Friday.

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5. The County and the Union agree that breaks for lunch and morning and afternoon rest periods will not be changed.

6. The County and the Union agree that use of benefit time will be required for any time not worked and that a day off will equal ten hours of benefit time.

7. Based on this explanation and our discussion with the Union representatives this proposal is acceptable.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF CONTRACT FOR CONVEYANCE OF CELLULAR TOWER SITE BY WINDHAM MOUNTAIN PARTNERS, LLC TO THE COUNTY OF GREENE

WHEREAS, Windham Mountain operates the Ski Windham Ski Resort in the Towns of Jewett and Windham, Greene County, New York; and

WHEREAS, following Tropical Storm Irene, the Greene County Department of Emergency Services, recognized the critical need for an additional cellular tower with microwave facilities site to ensure uninterrupted radio communication for Greene County's first responders and that of a consortium of upstate New York counties; and

WHEREAS, there are unique requirements to coordinate and communicate with first responders throughout Greene and adjoining counties which require the highest possible elevation for such a tower; and

WHEREAS, the County also requires additional broadband services for its residents which are beyond the capacity of existing tower facilities to take advantage of CFA or Connect New York Funding; and

WHEREAS, following inquiries, it was determined that the uses contemplated by the County cannot be accommodated on the existing tower; and

WHEREAS, there are very few, if any other privately owned "top of the mountain" sites and there is also a need for access to such a site for construction services, access and power for communication facilities on an expedited basis now and in the future; and

WHEREAS, Windham Mountain is unique in having existing infrastructure providing ready access to the top of its mounting including, access roadways, fiber optic and copper cables, heavy duty power lines, construction access roadways, and access by its ski lifts in the event of emergency conditions during difficult weather or for expedited emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Windham Mountain site is within the watershed of New York City and in a mountainous area which soil erosion and water pollution risks of creating construction and year round service access to a new site elsewhere would be exceptionally expensive and create protracted and expensive regulatory problems, delays and uncertainty; and

WHEREAS, the site, and much of Greene County, is situated within the highly protected Blue Zone of the Catskill Forest Preserve, where the aesthetics and environmental impact of construction of any cellular tower are a substantial concern; and

WHEREAS, the existence of the Windham Mountain ski lifts and slopes, another cellular tower, and structures on that site would render the proposed cellular tower site far less conspicuous and its construction and operation far less expensive and pose less, if any, risk of runoff or other adverse environmental consequences than any other location in Greene County, or elsewhere in the Catskill Mountain; and

WHEREAS, following completion of a thorough study and substantial due diligence,

the property of Windham Mountain was determined to be the ideal location, technologically, environmentally, and economically with all essential services available; and

WHEREAS, the availability of the Greene County tower will accommodate those uses which could otherwise have become lessees of a second private tower on lands of Windham Mountain; and

WHEREAS, the location of the proposed tower, to be owned and operated by Greene County, would preclude the opportunity of Windham Mountain to utilize this area for a valuable second commercial cellular tower; and

WHEREAS, Windham Mountain, to better provide for the protection, health, safety, welfare and benefit of the residents, businesses and emergency personnel in Greene County, and elsewhere throughout the Catskill Mountains, has offered to donate to Greene County the necessary land and access to its substantial facilities and infrastructure, together with an easement for service access and access to its facilities and power; and

WHEREAS, a negative declaration was issued on this project in accordance with 6NYCRR Part 617 State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) on September 18, 2013 and Greene County has secured all required permits and approvals; and

WHEREAS, Greene County is desirous of accepting and facilitating this donation and has agreed to do anything within its power and authority to minimize the adverse impact and any potential adverse environmental or aesthetic impacts and interference with the operation of the Windham Mountain Resort or the incurrence of any further or future liabilities of Windham Mountain.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the County of Greene is authorized to enter into a contract as above referenced, subject to approval as to form by the County Attorney.

SUBJECT: Demoliton Bids for FEMA Flood Buyout Properties

Bids were opened on May 7, 2014 for the demolition of Flood Buyout Properties as part of the of FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Buyout Program.

Six (6) bids were received, including those from Dan's Hauling & Demo Inc. of Wyantskill, NY; Washington Estates Transport Inc. of Rosendale NY; David Frueh Contracting LLC of Glenmont NY; Standard Demolition Services, Inc of Trumbull Ct, Classic Environmental Inc of Latham, NY; and Evergreen Mountain Contracting Inc. of West Kill NY.

The program is using federal hazard mitigation funding for the acquisition of properties located in flood prone areas and demolition of flood-damaged structures thereon.

**Resolution Calling On Governor Andrew Cuomo And The
New York State Senate To Release Individual School Districts
From Mandating Veterans Real Property School Tax
Exemptions, And Ensuring That New York State Will
Immediately And Forever Reimburse All School Districts,
Annually, For Veterans Real Property School Tax
Exemptions**

WHEREAS, on December 18th, 2013, Governor Andrew Cuomo signed into law, Bill S01199, an act to amend the real property tax law, in relation to authorizing certain exemptions from school district real property tax for veterans; and

WHEREAS, this amendment to the real property tax law allows for School Districts to extend a real property tax exemption for School Taxes to Veterans in their respective districts; and

WHEREAS, this amendment places the responsibility for enacting any Veterans real property tax exemption for School Taxes onto the respective districts' school boards; and

WHEREAS, this amendment does not specify an entity fiscally liable for the potential tax burden created upon any School District's enactment of such resolution allowable by this amendment; and

WHEREAS, Greene County School Districts have presumed from the language of this amendment that any additional tax burden must be absorbed by the School Districts, or shifted to the non-Veteran real property owners of the respective School Districts; and

WHEREAS, this additional tax burden has been rejected by all but two School Districts in Greene County; thereby, denying Veterans of this benefit; and

WHEREAS, Governor Andrew Cuomo and the numerous New York State Senatorial sponsor and co-sponsors of Bill S01199 publicly stated their desire and intent in enacting this bill for the benefit of New York State Military Veterans; and

WHEREAS, RPTL Section 458, enacted before the year 1896, and subsequent amendments until now, includes General Municipal Taxes unless disallowed by local option;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greene County Legislature hereby calls upon Governor Andrew Cuomo and the New York State Senate to enact further legislation removing the burden of mandating this exemption from the individual School Districts, and release the School Districts including the non-Veteran real property owners, from any tax burden imposed, when School Districts provide this benefit to Veterans as per the New York State Real Property Tax Law Veterans Tax Exemption; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Greene County Legislature hereby calls upon Governor Andrew Cuomo and the New York State Senate to enact legislation ensuring that New York State will immediately and forever reimburse each School District the definitive

total of the Veterans Real Property Tax Exemption each fiscal budget year.

WHEREAS, New York State has announced the availability of funding through the 2014 Regional Economic Development Council Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) Initiative; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Department of Economic Development, Tourism & Planning has identified priority projects in furtherance of its economic development objectives; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the County of Greene to make application to the Capital Region Economic Development Council for CFA funding;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of the Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Planning is authorized to file Consolidated Funding Applications with the State of New York for the following projects:

The Greene County Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Planning is recommending that the County authorize submission and make financial commitment towards two Consolidated Funding Applications.

1. Infrastructure Feasibility Project – The CFA application program source is the ESD Strategic Planning and Feasibility Studies Program, specifically designed for communities for the preparation of county-wide plans to assess sites for economic development. This project is to inventory, map, and analyze municipal water and wastewater treatment facilities within the County for the purposes of determining current availability and capacity; recommending actions and funding sources for expansion; and identifying locations and economic development opportunities for site specific development of properties in proximity to the infrastructure. The program has a maximum grant funding category award of \$100,000. We are working with Delaware Engineering and the Greene County IDA to scope out the project description and determine the final budget. We are requesting a financial commitment from Greene County in an amount of up to \$100,000, although the project and state request could be less, once the final budget is determined. The funds would not need to be appropriated until the 2015 budget.
2. Invest in Greene Project – The CFA application program source is the ESD Market New York Program, specifically designed for communities that will support regionally themed projects by promoting tourism destinations, attractions, and special events. This project is being offered to expand the impact and awareness of the County's Buy Local Campaign with the addition of an "Invest Local" Business Attraction Campaign providing advertising and marketing funds promoting our downtowns; identifying the availability of vacant and underutilized businesses; and employing state of the art digital marketing, search engine optimization and social media tools. The project is being designed to replicate our successful destination tourism marketing efforts, including the creation of a new Business Advisory Committee. Chambers of Commerce, local business interests and property owners will be necessary participants in the execution of the marketing campaigns. The plan is to attract businesses and entrepreneurs to our communities, encouraging them to open businesses, in turn, serving our local community needs and those of the tourists and second home owners, all compatible target audiences. The target markets will include the NYC metro area, Lower Hudson Valley, and the Capital Region. KathodeRay Media is our Buy Local media firm and has assisted with the development of the rebranded and refocused campaign. We are requesting a financial commitment from Greene County in the amount of \$100,000, which would be applied to our 2015 Buy Local Program.

In analyzing our expenditures through the first quarter of 2014, we have noted a significant deficiency in our account 6123.4000 Juvenile Delinquents/Persons In Need of Supervision (JD/PINS). At the time that we were preparing our 2014 budget requests in July of 2013, there were no children in our care with a JD/PINS designation, and the only expenses that had been incurred to date were for a minimal number of detention days.

We had estimated that the total cost in this appropriation in 2013 would be approximately \$70,000, and our original budget request was for the same amount. In November 2013 one child was adjudicated a JD/PINS, and our budget request was amended to \$125,000 just prior to final budget enactment. Subsequently, two additional children have been adjudicated JD/PINS, and therefore our appropriation is rapidly depleting. We anticipate that we will fully expend the account by the end of May.

At this point in time, we see the possibility of some savings in our Family Assistance appropriation account 6109.4000, and therefore respectfully request the following transfer of funds:
