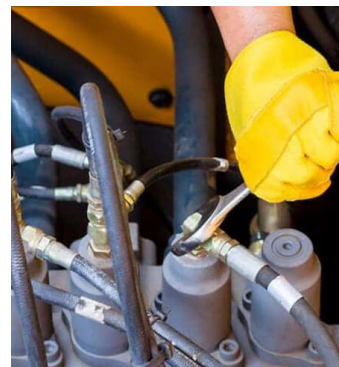

Infrastructure Enhancements Attracting New Development in Catskill and Cairo

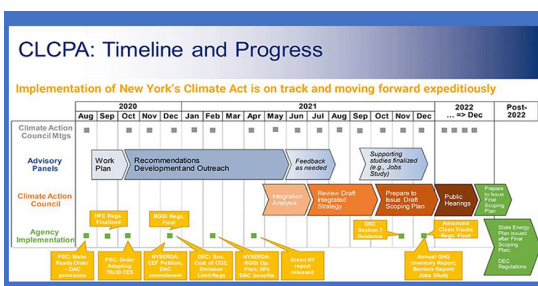


Three partner projects between Greene County and the Greene IDA will be providing infrastructure necessary to attract and retain businesses that provide products, services and contribute to economic growth. Extension of natural gas lines will enable Columbia Memorial Health to build a new facility in Catskill at the Exit 21 West property, along with Greene County's new Community Health Center. Stewarts Shops will expand to a new location at the Exit 21 East property along with a new hotel. This infrastructure expansion creates incentives for development at both the East and West properties. Construction of a water/sewer extension will create shovel-ready properties for development at a site on NYS 23 in Cairo. Opposition to NYS Climate Mandates that Adversely Affect Local Rural Economies

The Greene County Legislature joined the Boards of Supervisors from Delaware and Schoharie Counties in opposition to mandates contained in the NYS Climate Council's Draft Scoping Plan. In its unanimously adopted resolution, the legislature opposed over 20 mandates and policies included in the plan that was developed at the state level, with no input from local municipalities that will be affected. In this action, the Greene

County Legislature vigorously objects to the mandate approach by the Climate Council for implementing requirements regardless of cost and feasibility, and strongly urges residents and business owners to contact their NYS Representatives at all levels. This machine, which is easy to use and odor and pest-free, will help reduce food waste. Once each cycle of material is broken down compost will be made available. Residents are encouraged to bring a bucket from home and get some for your own personal use!
