2023 Annual Report

We thank the Greene County Legislature for their continued support to the Greene County Libraries' Association, as their financial assistance helps us meet the needs of our Greene County borrowers. We provide more than just books. That's the tip of the iceberg. There's so much more to libraries! By broadening our network connections, we are an oasis to the public. We provide connectivity to the most vulnerable. As a trusted institution, we provide assistance with technology skills and safety to help people be more independent. Our libraries use locally relevant content, support local artists; and have contact with many local nonprofits and businesses for programming; outreach, and volunteering. We provide opportunities to the public for meaningful connections in our community. The Greene County Legislature helps us accomplish this.

There are a total of 24,378 Greene County active Library Card Holders in 2023.

Libraries in Greene County continue to find new ways to help and serve their communities. We saw an overall increase of **31% more programs being offered**, a **35% increase in program attendance**, and **a 16% increase in electronic**

checkouts compared to last year.

Programs which our Greene County Libraries held this year included:

Radio Play; Author Talks; Artist Lecture Series with Catskill Mountain Foundation; Healthy Heart Series; Story Treasure Boxes; Narcan Training; Understanding Alzheimer's and Dementia; Meet-Up Monday; DIY Gifts & Gratitude; College Night; Hot Dog! Story Time; Holiday Stroll; Journey with Journey; Birdwatching; Robotics team (the Evarts Engineers–At their first competition of the season at the VEX tournament at The Mount Academy; competing with 30 other teams and won the coveted Judge's Award).

Outreach Services included visits to Home Sweet Home on the Hudson; The Eliot at Catskill; Catskill Senior Center; Hearthstone Senior Day Care; Coxsackie Senior Center; a Pop-Up Library at Bethany Village; a Pop-Up Library at the Rivertown Senior Apartments and Home Sweet Home assisted living facility bringing a curated selection of books and other media; along with requests made by the residents. We place holds and issue library cards all on the go.

Together in total we offered **2,198 Library Programs** throughout Greene County in 2023. With a **grand total in attendance of 22,292 patrons**. Our libraries also answered more than **37,048 reference questions** and continue to provide free Wifi after hours.

Library patrons of Greene County downloaded a total of **55,663 electronic content items**, a **16% increase from last year.** These are all of the digital resources we offer such as e-books; digital audiobooks, videos, and music. We are grateful the County assists us in helping us to meet the demand our patrons have for our electronic materials. Library physical materials circulated totaled 18,079 items.

2023 Financials:

- \$20,500 of total county funding was divided among the 8 libraries for Resident Support
- \$3,800 went to technical support
- \$3,000 went towards the on-line databases that provide access to reliable health info; business resources; history and genealogy; and homework help as well as e-magazines
- \$4,000 went for eBook and audiobooks
- \$700 went to tax preparation
- \$1,900 went to outreach (brochures) Book Pages subscription; and a subscription to Hudson River Valley Heritage. HRVH consists of digital collections from libraries and cultural heritage institutions that document the rich history of the Hudson River Valley. Hundreds of images and documents have been added during the past few years of the pandemic.


