The sun shine brightly on a particular September morning. But this was not just another. This date was September 11 - a date that we will never forget and remember those we lost. As has been the tradition for several years, Greene County took time out to remember those we lost – both on that fateful day and First Responders who gave their life in the line of duty.

Greene County Legislature Chairman Patrick Linger served as the Master of Ceremonies. After the posting of colors by a joint Color Guard, the crowd stood respectful as they said the Pledge of Allegiance. This was followed by our National Anthem. Rabbi Zoe Zak gave an invocation. The keynote speaker was Retired NYS Police Major/USAF David Kolb. He gave a moving speech on his role in September 11, 2001. As in most ceremonies, key elected officials (Senator Michelle Hinchey and Assemblyman Chris Tague) also spoke. Added to the roll call and memorial at the county's Emergency Management Services building were NYS Trooper Ivan Morales and Freehold Firefighter Aaron Matthews. Richard Frasco and Sheriff Pete Kusminsky read the names one by one of our fallen Greene Count heroes, as the bell sounded. Pastor Joel Zimmerman gave the benediction followed by a moment of silence. The Greenville American Legion gave a Three Volley Salute with Taps. The event ended with God Bless America and the retiring of the colors.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

E J Arthur Elementary School (Athens): As part of Fire Prevention Week, the Town of Athens Fire Service (Athens Volunteer Fire Department and West Athens-Lime Street Fire Company) hosted their annual fire prevention program. On Day One, AVFD were at E J Arthur Elementary School conducting in-classroom, fire prevention day activities. The next day, students were welcomed at the AVFD firehouse where they practiced what they learned. Students got to use actual fire extinguishers, and thru the use of WALS Fire Safety House were able to practice crawling low to safety, exiting their home and going to their meeting spot. They witnessed demonstrations on extrication and water rescue, as well as saw various firetrucks. As part of the session, Greene County Sheriff's Office K-9 unit, the Town of Catskill ambulance, MedFlight and Greene County Paramedics also presented displays.

Training authorization letter must be completed by chief

FIRE OFFICER 1 MODULE SERIES (Comp. Training & Community Risk Reduction) Company Training & Community Risk Reduction course provides current and potential fire officers with a basic knowledge of how to determine company-level training needs, teaching from a lesson plan, documentation of training activities, and different methods to conduct company-level training. Additionally, this course covers the basic responsibilities of the fire officer as they relate to community relations, company-level building inspections, and community risk reduction. This course is based upon the requirements found in Chapter 4 of NFPA 1021, Standard for Fire Officer Professional Qualifications – 12 hours

Prerequisites: Firefighter I, or Basic Firefighter, or Firefighting Essentials

ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS

Duties and responsibilities of the engine company: it builds on the fire behavior knowledge presented to students in BEFO & IFO/SCBA courses, fire extinguishment using hose/nozzle systems, standpipes, and master streams. It thoroughly examines different types of hose and nozzles and hydraulically evaluates flows from different hose/nozzle systems to ensure the proper flow is achieved. It concludes with live fire evolutions focusing on operations as an engine company. – 24 hours

Prerequisites: Firefighter I or equivalent and students must also be physically capable of wearing SCBA and possess current medical clearance for SCBA use November 12,14,19,21,26 December 3,5,10 6:30 pm

FIRE POLICE

Full Description: Trains fire police to perform their duties more effectively. It includes defining and interpreting terms, oath of office, relation to regular police officers, general duties, maintaining safe conditions at an emergency, traffic direction and control, pre-planning, and various laws of interest to the fire service. Under the provision of General Municipal Law, Section 209-c, this course, when approved by OFPC, must be completed by every fire police officer who was appointed after September 1, 1980. - 21 hours




